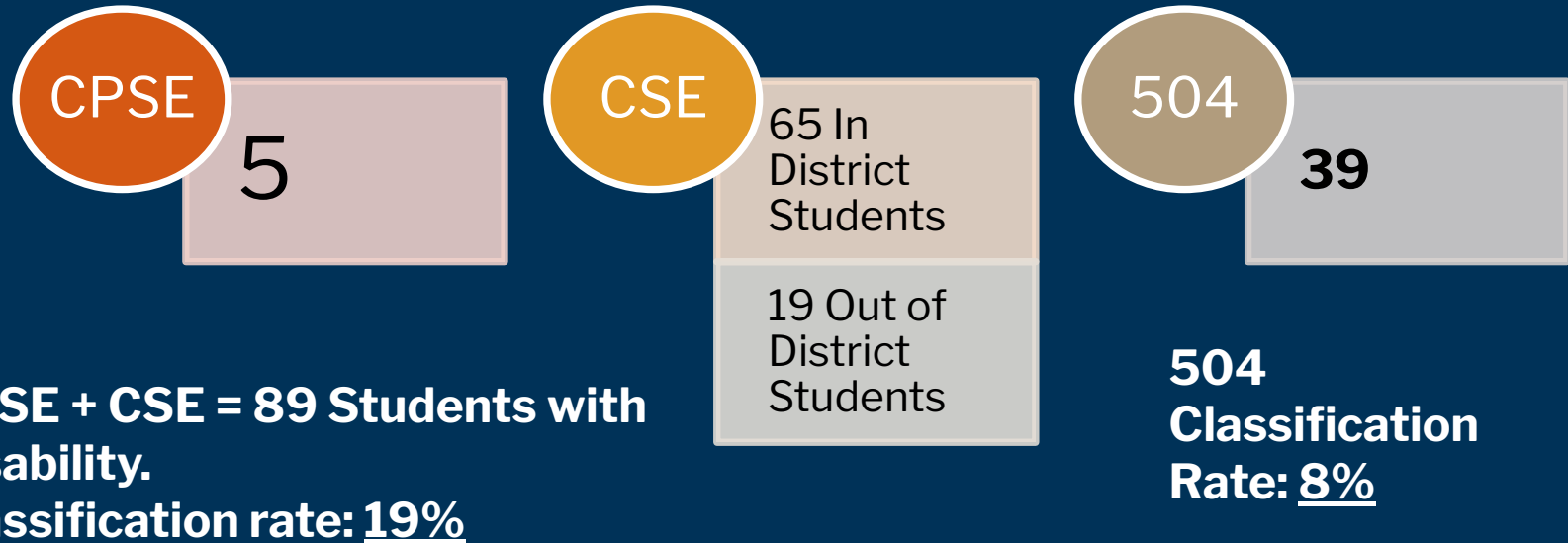

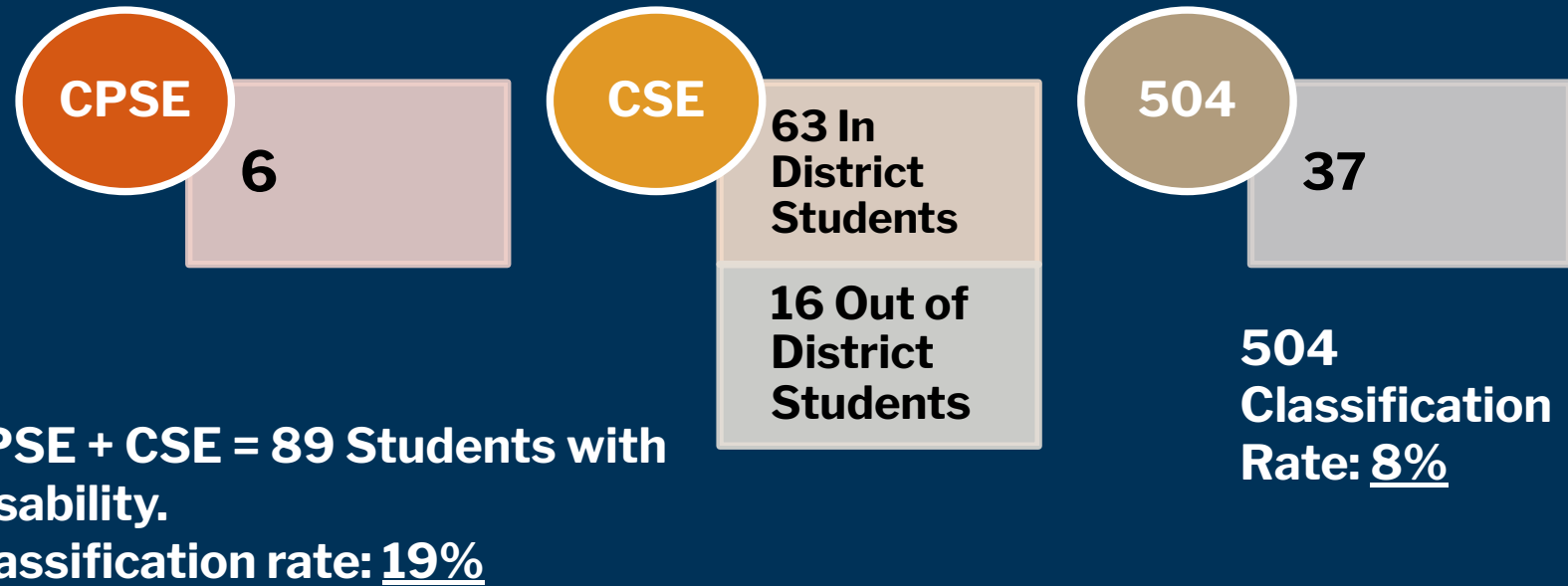

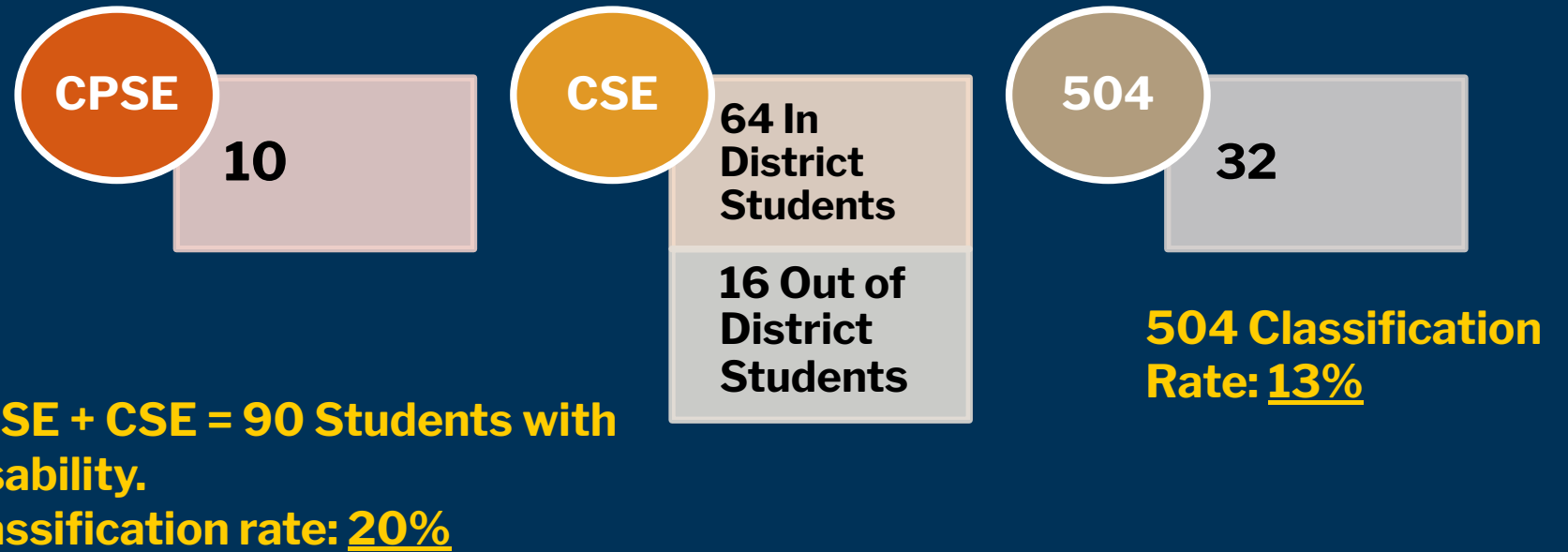

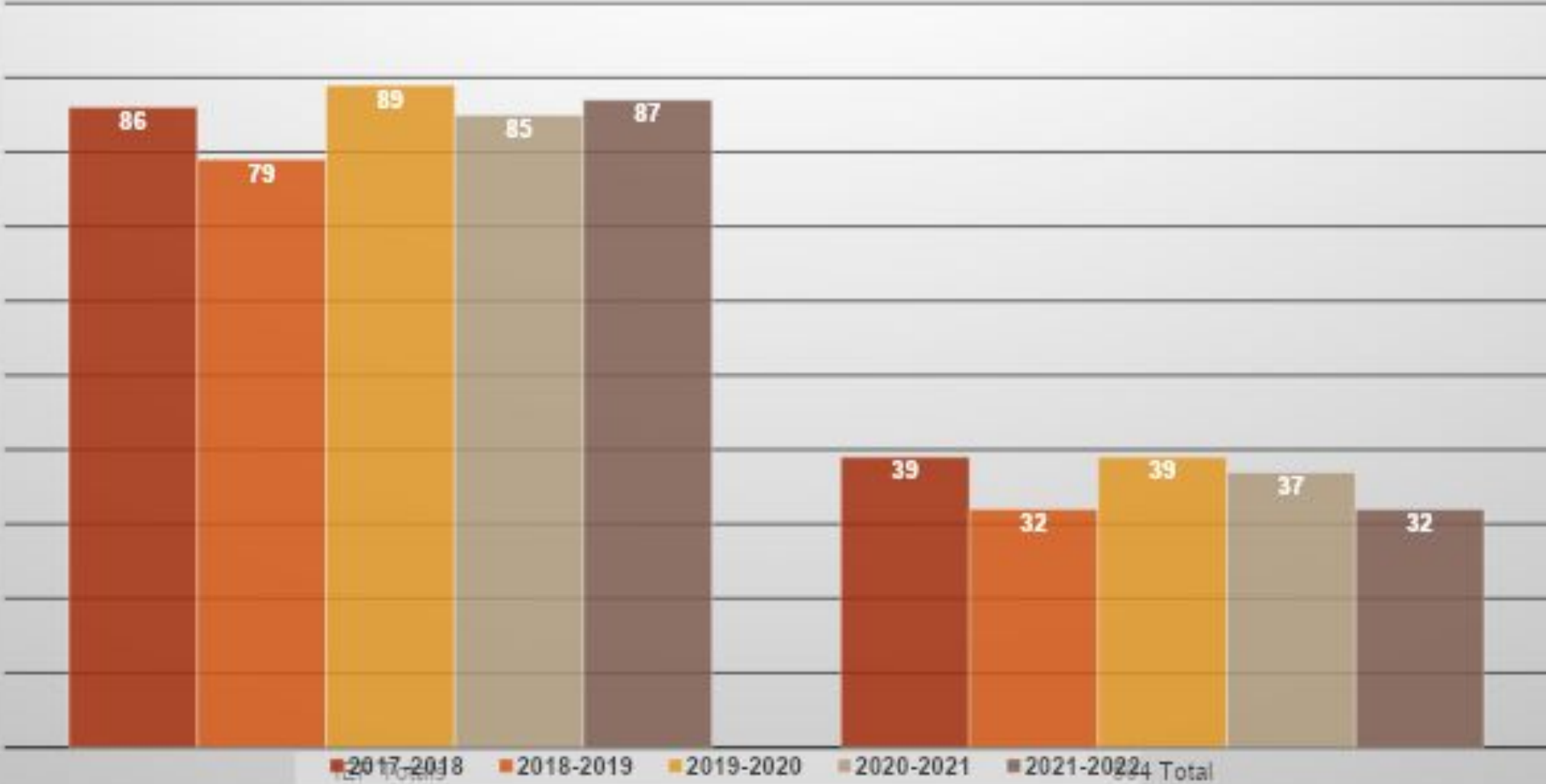

Finances

STAC: System to Track and Account for Children

- 2020-2021 Extended School Year:
- Reimbursement
- Our cost: **\$37,100**
 - aid given on transportation **(80%)**
 - aid given for tuition **(80%)**
- State determines threshold Anything over that is aid able: **\$56,682.**

Federal Allocations for Special Education

- IDEA authorizes grants to states for Students with Disabilities
- Section 611 & 619 Grants are used to offset part of the costs of the education of SWDs.
 - 611 Funds: used for ages 3-21
 - 619 Funds: used for ages 3-5
- BVCS grant awards for 2020-2021 School year
 - 611: \$ **133,216**
 - 619: \$ **4,816**

Medicaid

We started billing this year. It was a long process to set up the district Medicaid account.
on 9/29/21 we began receiving payments.
Total for the 20-21 School year:
\$ 20,824

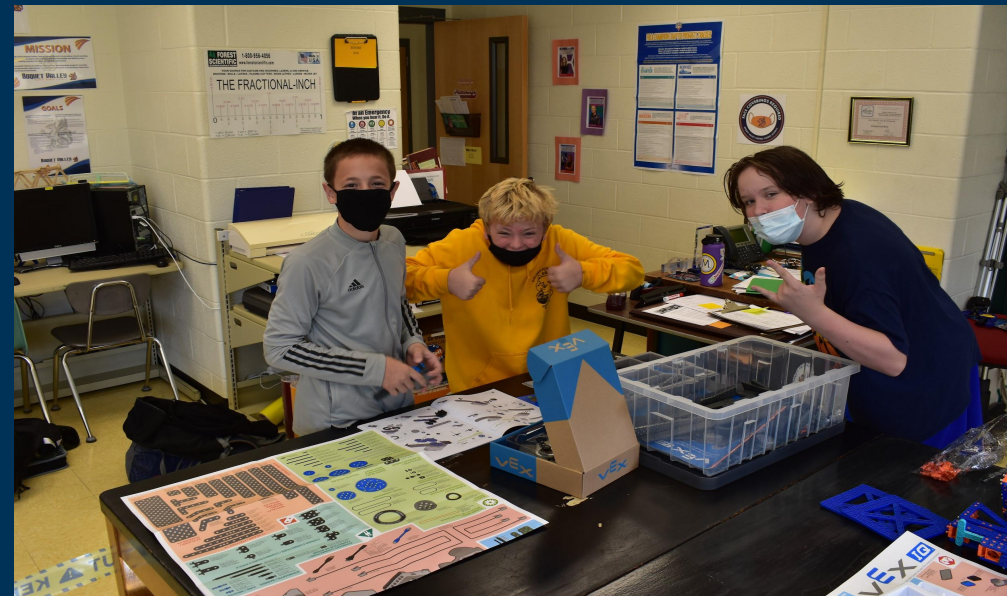
Creating robots of all types:

- Ball flinging robot to entertain a dog



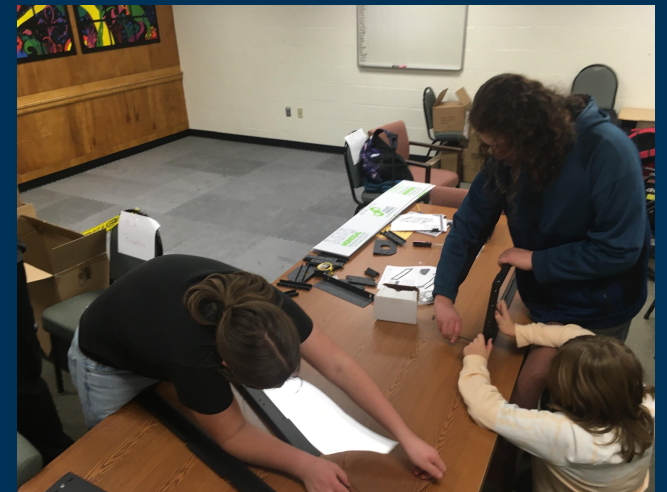
Middle School Robotics Club Activity

 - 2 Spec Ed students from 8:1:1 room

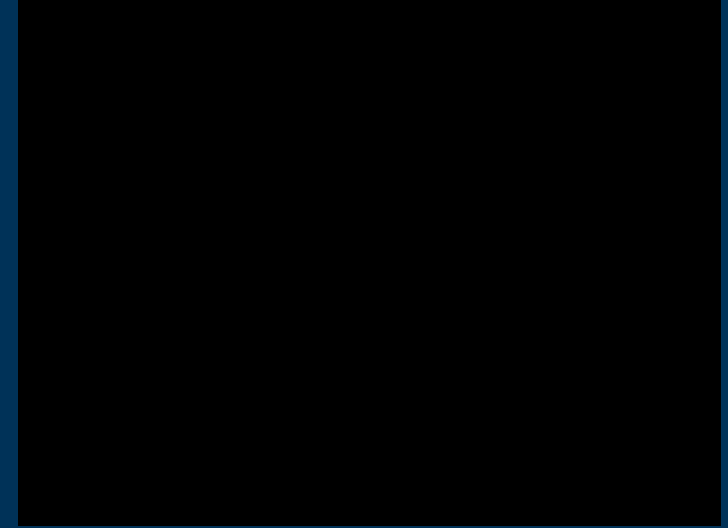
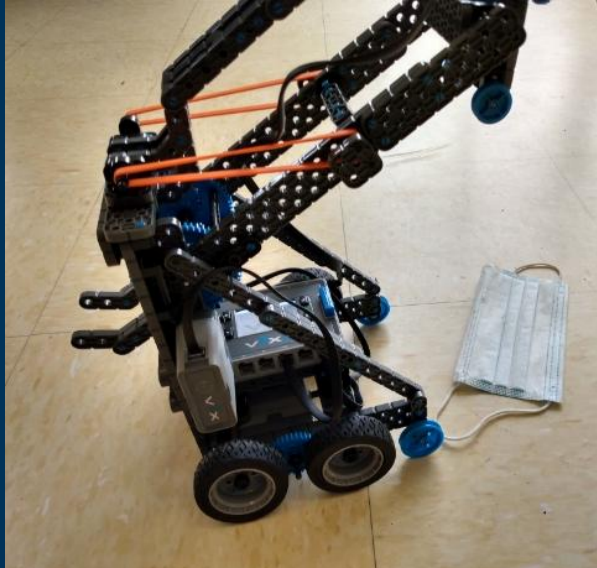


High School Robotics Club Activity
