

SAT Exams: To keep students safe, and in alignment with public health guidance and school closures across 192 countries, College Board will not be able to administer the SAT or SAT Subject Tests on June 6, 2020.

If it's safe from a public health standpoint, College Board will provide weekend SAT administrations every month through the end of the calendar year, <u>beginning in August</u>. This includes a <u>new administration in September</u> and the previously scheduled tests on **August 29**. **October 3**, **November 7**, and **December 5**.

Students can register for these administrations <u>starting in May</u>. We'll contact students directly when we have the exact date. Eligible students can register with a fee waiver.

ACT Exams: As CDC and local guidelines for safety allow, ACT will offer its June and July national test dates as scheduled and will additionally provide makeup test dates for June and July. The test dates are **June 13** and **July 18**. In addition to the three previously planned fall test dates on **September 12**, **October 24** and **December 12**, ACT will also offer a remote proctoring option for the ACT test in late fall/early winter 2020, allowing students to take the test at their home on a computer. ACT will launch the test-at-home option as part of its national testing program.

Advanced Placement (AP) Examinations: The exams will only include topics and skills most AP teachers and students have already covered in class by early March.

Like many college-level exams, this year's AP Exams will be open book/open note.

Most exams will have <u>one or two free-response questions</u>, and each question is timed separately. Students will need to write and submit their responses within the allotted time for each question.

For most subjects, the exams will be <u>45 minutes long</u>, and include an additional 5 minutes for uploading. Students will need to access the online testing system 30 minutes early to get set up.

Students will be able to take exams on any device they have access to—computer, tablet, or smartphone. They will be able to either type and upload their responses or write responses by hand and submit a photo via their cell phone.

- AP Computer Science Principals: There will be no end-of-year exam in Computer Science Principles—the
 AP Exam score will be computed from the Create and Explore Performance Tasks. The deadline for
 submission of Performance Questions in the Digital Portfolio is extended to May 26, 11:59 p.m. ET
